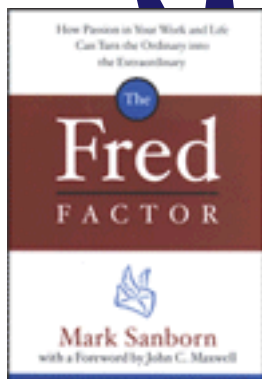


Need a Good Book to Read?

We now have the following selections added to our bookstore. These are recommendations of Dr. Purvis.



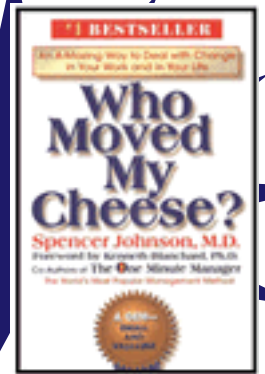
The Fred Factor by Mark Sanborn

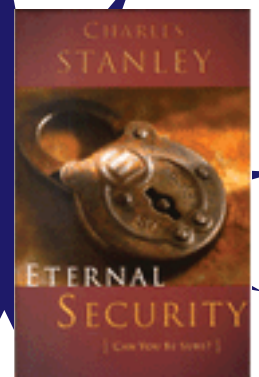
The Janitor by Todd Hopkins & Ray Hilbert
